

# Connecting Edmonton Seniors Discussion Forum Guidelines

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## Discussion posts

We ask that you're respectful in your comments. We reserve the right to remove anything we deem:

- Abusive or personal attacks: We want to hear your views about seniors and seniors' isolation. Don't make personal attacks on any person, or organization.
- Material that is obscene, defamatory, threatening, harassing, abusive, slanderous, hateful, embarrassing to any other entity.
- Anything illegal or that condones or encourages other people to act unlawfully
- Third party advertising: We won't publish posts that contain advertising messages
- Posting links or directing others to sites containing viruses, corrupted files, or anything that may cause damage to or interfere with computer hardware or software, or to material which is offensive.
- Chain letters or 'spam'.
- Personal details: Don't enter your own or anyone else's personal details, including account numbers, etc.

We encourage discussions where:

- Postings are meaningful: This is your chance to say what you feel, so use straightforward language to make your point as clearly as possible.
- Postings are kept short: Try to make a single point in a maximum of about 100 words. If you have more than one point to make, post another message.
- Postings contain information you are happy for everyone to see.
- Postings contain comments or messages that are related to social isolation and resources/ideas to prevent isolation.
- Postings contain only comments or messages with your own opinions.

## Using comments, ideas and images

You confirm any material (like suggestions, ideas, videos or photos) you post belongs to you and does not infringe anyone else's intellectual property rights.
